

ABOUT YOUR JUDGES.

FLO BARKER (Flinthill)

I have grown up with cats and dogs but our first Irish Setter, Connie (Over The Hills and Far Away), was from the Blenvara kennel in County Durham and arrived in 1988. Ever since then, my house has always been home to an Irish though they have had to share the sofa with a few pointers!

Lanstara Summer Thyme at Flinthill joined us in 1993 from Viv Blackshaw. By then I had decided to have a shot at the show ring and Dinah went on to some nice wins, including third place in Border Counties Gundog Top Dog competition in 1996. More importantly, she had a litter of beautiful pups, sired by Catriona Lowe's Reddins Connal and became my first PAT dog, visiting homes for the elderly and people with learning difficulties.

My next Irish Setter, Lanstara Field Of Dreams at Flinthill, also from Viv, was a PAT dog too and had some success in the show ring. By this time, my husband was keen to have an Irish Setter dog and so after a visit to Maritta Bott, Bardonhill Mountain Song at Flinthill arrived in 2006. Sam enjoyed the show ring and was BPIS at the Irish Setter Club of Scotland Championship Show in 2007 but sadly, we lost him at an early age due to a cancer.

My current Irish Setter is Danaway Tilly at Flinthill, bred by Mary Gurney. She too was a PAT dog while we were still in the Northeast, and was so gentle and sensitive with the elderly people she visited. I feel she made a real difference to their lives. She has had two litters of pups, sired by Tania Gardner's Quensha Walk Me Home to Danwish and Paula Lucas' Sh Ch Bardonhill Eternal Flame Among Amberlight. Tilly is now retired from the show ring and enjoying the Devon sunshine!

I first awarded tickets in Pointers back in 2011 and have continued to judge that breed over the years. My first appointment to judge Irish at Championship Show level was 2019 at Richmond CS and then at Leeds CS in 2023.

I am greatly looking forward to judging Dogs at the Breeders Club show in March and feel proud to have the opportunity to do so. Irish Setters will always have a special place in my heart, and I cannot imagine life without one.

MISS BECKY BOX (Fernstart)

My parents were involved in showing and breeding Irish Setters before I was born so the breed has always been a massive part of my life. I was a keen junior handler in my early teens and was also a member of the Kennel Club Junior Organisation, (now the YKC) winning an award for a project on the breed. In 1985 I won my first championship show first prize at Setter and Pointer with Blackborough Jade (Sh Ch Sowerhill Satyr of Fearley ex Joanma's Ossa of Blackborough) – that's now over 40 years ago!!

I purchased my first 'Fernstart' (Fearnely Beatrice) from Pat and Barry Rhodes in 1990. She was followed by Fearnely Firemelody in 1994 and things have progressed from there. A childhood dream was fulfilled in 2006 when Ferstart Irish Rhapsody won her class at Crufts, which is still a very special memory. A number of my dogs have won their stud book number, including Fernstart Lovesong and more recently Ferstart Hearts Delight but so far the star of my small kennel has been Sh Ch Bardonhill Afternoon D'Lite at Fernstart who was born in 2013.

As a teenager I served on the committee of my local kennel society which organised two open shows per year and a ringcraft class, going on to be Chair until the society was wound up. I have been a member of the ISAE committee since 2000, including serving as Hon. Treasurer for 3 years and the Hon. Secretary for 16 years, including the Association's centenary year in 2008 and all the special events that took place that year.

My breed judging career started at a local open show on my 17th birthday and I awarded CC's for the first time at Manchester in 2010. My appointment at ISBC will be the 6th occasion that I have awarded CC's in the breed.

After all these years I still enjoy nothing more than spending time with our beautiful breed, whether at home, out in the fields or at a show, and with those who share a love of Irish Setters. Thank you to the ISBC committee for the honour of being invited to judge at your show. I am looking forward to the day enormously.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

In accordance with Royal Kennel Club guidelines, Exhibitors must display exhibit number / owner identification on their crates, cage or container at all times.

WELFARE OF DOGS

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Royal Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Royal Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Royal Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations.

Right to refuse Entries: Exhibitors / Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Royal Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entries.

DOG LITTER

Many owners responsibly package their animal's waste. However, they then spoil this by leaving the packets all over the site. Please ensure that such packets are put into the bins provided for this purpose

DOGS IN WHICH OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS HAVE AN INTEREST, SHALL NOT BE EXHIBITED AT ISBC CLUB SHOWS

HEALTH AND SAFETY

A nominated Safety Officer will be in attendance throughout the show. Exhibitors and spectators are reminded that just as the Irish Setter Breeders Club has responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, all those present have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take the greatest care to avoid all uneven surfaces, guy ropes, and other hazards, which are inevitable and an integral element of a dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, trolleys, cages and grooming tables also have a responsibility to ensure that their tools, equipment and collapsible furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Exhibitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site. Exhibitors show at their own risk, if conditions are not ideal or are unsafe, they may withdraw their dogs from classes.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

All electrical equipment **MUST** be PAT tested with an up-to-date certificate. Any exhibitor wishing to use an electrical appliance e.g. hairdryer, must seek the permission of the building's landlord and **MUST** produce a current PAT label attached to the appliance, to the Show Manager, otherwise the equipment will be removed by members of the committee and returned at the end of the show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8.30 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received until 11 am after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
3. Judging will commence in both rings at 9.30am.
4. This is an **UNBENCHED** show
- 4a Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.

5. **Entry Fees: Members** £18.00 First Entry per Dog; (to Include Catalogue). Each subsequent entry with the same dog Free. Baby Puppy Class at £5.00 per Dog **Non-Members** £22.00 First Entry per Dog; Each subsequent entry with the same dog £3.00. Baby Puppy Class at £7.00 per Dog Not For Competition @ £5 per Dog. Catalogues – £3.00 prepaid with entries only. **Advertisements in the Catalogue:** Full Page £8.00 / £5.00 Half Page.
Membership: UK Members - £12 Single; £13 Joint; European Members - £16; Rest of the World - £19.
6. **Prize Money:** There will be no Prize Money on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show** - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a Puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other Puppy exhibited at the same Show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best in Show is a Puppy it may at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show.
A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Show may be declared from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy classes. There must be no progression to further competition
11. **Best in Show** - Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Royal Kennel Club Regulation F. (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the U.K. must be issued with a Royal Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor / competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.**
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and The Royal Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at R.K.C. licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE A RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Royal Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Royal Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Royal Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Royal Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not For Competition entries are accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Royal Kennel Club registered.
19. Societies may accept Not For Competition entries at their discretion for dogs aged three calendar months and over.
20. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of The Royal Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
21. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.

22. The Show will be held under Royal Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
23. SPECIAL PRIZES (*vide R.K.C. Reg 25*) – Unless a dog has won a class prize or reserve, it is ineligible to compete for any 'Special'. A dog may not compete for a prize for Best in Show, Reserve Best in Show or Best Either Sex in Show unless it has competed in a class.
24. There will be no benching available at this show. Identification of the exhibit must be attached to any cage etc. In accordance with Royal Kennel Club rules.
25. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, detention of or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
26. Should any Judge be prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge or Judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees can be returned.
27. Each Judge will be instructed and empowered to withhold any prize in any class if of the opinion that the dog does not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in this schedule. A Judge's decision shall be final except in a case of fraud, or misrepresentation or where a mistake has been made, bona fide by the Judge. No alterations of the award must be made after the date of the show without specific permission of The Royal Kennel Club (*Vide R.K.C. Rules 21K & L*).
28. Should any question arise not provided for in these Regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject to appeal to The Royal Kennel Club.
29. Parents are reminded that they are responsible for the action of and damage caused by their children within the environs of the Show.
30. The Committee of the Irish Setter Breeders Club can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stall holders and/or Trade Stands at their Show. Persons attending Club Shows are reminded that the products on sale by Trade Stands, for the preparation and grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition. (*R.K.C.S.R.(F)*).
31. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Royal Kennel Club Licensed show, within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
32. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Royal Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
33. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word 'dog' includes both sexes)

In the following Definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. Saturday 28th February 2026. Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering in Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted.

A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:- (1)

Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 20.

(2) *Transfer:*

- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

BABY PUPPY: A baby puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

MAIDEN: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate / CACIB / CAC / Green Star or a First Prize at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate / CACIB / CAC / Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

UNDERGRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate / CACIB / CAC / Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Undergraduate, Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Limit or Open classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate / CACIB / CAC / Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate / CACIB / CAC / Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Royal Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CCs / CACIB / CAC / Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Royal Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CCs / CACIB / CAC / Green Stars or won seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

BEGINNERS: For Owner, Handler or Exhibit not having won a First prize at a Championship or Open show.

BRACE: For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than brace.

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

From London and M40 Leave the M40 at junction 15 and join the A46 dual carriageway towards Coventry. Follow the signs for National Agricultural Centre or NAC Stoneleigh Park until you pick up the signs for Stoneleigh Park. These signs will direct you to Stoneleigh Park Main Entrance on the B4113.

From the M6 or M69 Leave the M6 Motorway at junction 2 and join the A46 towards Warwick, OR at the conclusion of the M69, continue on the A46 towards Warwick and the M40. Follow the signs for National Agricultural Centre or NAC Stoneleigh Park until you pick up the signs for Stoneleigh Park. These signs will direct you to Stoneleigh Park Main Entrance on the B4113

From the Northbound M1 Leave the M1 at junction 17, to join the M45 towards Coventry. Stay on the M45 until you see the signs for A45 Coventry (NOT A45 Daventry). Follow the A45 until you pick up signs for the A46 Warwick. Follow the signs for National Agricultural Centre or NAC Stoneleigh Park until you pick up the signs for Stoneleigh Park. These signs will direct you to Stoneleigh Park Main Entrance on the B4113.
